We send regular email details of burglaries and vehicle crimes, courtesy of Elmbridge police. We also have access to the underlying data for all neighbourhood crime, and so below is an update of *all* Neighbourhood crime types from Jan '21 to Dec '24, with a comparison between years and identifying trends.

Crime map review

As before, our crime data is grouped by electoral wards. (For anyone uncertain of the boundaries of the wards, there's a map at the end of this article). To provide a reasonable comparison, we have reviewed data in the new format dating back to Jan 2021 and up to the latest available data.

First, to set the scene for crime rates, let's view how Elmbridge compares with the rest of Surrey.

An analysis of the national crime data for Surrey for the full year Jan-Dec 2024 reveals that Elmbridge (*highlighted yellow*) continues to have the 2nd lowest overall crime rate out of the 11 boroughs in Surrey! Previously (2023) it had been 4th lowest, and the 3 boroughs with lower crime rates were more rural.

Of the 14 neighbourhood crime types, the 4 highest rates in previous years (*highlighted orange*) had been Violence & Sexual Offences, Anti-social Behaviour, Public Order, and Criminal Damage & Arson, accounting for 64% of the total crime. These are also closely related, as often an ASB offence could easily become a violence offence (if the suspect pushes someone), or a public order offence (if the

activities intimidate innocent bystanders), or criminal damage (if the activities result in something being damaged). Looking at these 4 crime types combined provides a smoother crime trend. (Within Elmbridge, Violence and Sexual Offences were rarely sexual and most violent crimes were common assault.)

Next, let's compare the crime data for the 16 electoral wards within Elmbridge.

Elmbridge has a very low crime rate within Surrey, and Claygate ward within Elmbridge is in the lower half of the table of total crimes. However, overall crime increased in Claygate by 4.2%, whilst crime across Elmbridge has decreased by 9.7%, so Claygate has now moved from 2nd to 6th lowest.

Now, we can compare crime data for Jan-Dec 2024 with the same period in 2023. The following table shows the variation in numbers of crimes with crime types sorted by highest to lowest number of crimes in Jan-Jun 2024. The same figures are given for Elmbridge as a whole.




Overall the increase of 4.2% amounts to 13 additional crimes. These are due to increases in burglary (+18), Vehicle Crime (+8) and Other Theft (+7), offset by decreases in Violence & Sexual Offences (-6) and Anti-social Behaviour (-20).

Burglaries and Vehicle Crimes have decreased across Elbridge in 2024, however Claygate has the highest increases of all wards in both.


The following table gives a better picture of how the various crime types have changed between Jan-Dec 2023 and 2024. They are shown in order of largest increase to largest decrease.



Of course, this only reflects the overall total for Jan-Dec 2024. For a better idea of annual trends we need to look in comparison to previous years' crime rates. First, we see that the overall crime rate confirms the trend above 2023 levels throughout Q1 and Q2, although closer or lower after April.




For Elmbridge, in Jan-Jun 2023, Violence and Sexual Offences, Anti-social Behaviour (ASB), Public Order, and Criminal Damage and Arson, collectively accounted for 65.5% of the total crime. For Claygate that figure was 69.6% and in 2024 it is now 58.0%, The '24 trend is very close to that of '23, but the total is down by 28 (13%).




The crimes that have the most impact on victims are Burglary and Vehicle Crime, accounting for 9.1% and 10.0% respectively of total crime in 2024 in Claygate.


Burglary in Claygate had a high increase (+18) in 2024 compared to 2023. The chart reveals that the trend has been tracking similar to but a little above '23 levels, but with a significant peak (7) in March '24.



The Vehicle Crime rate has increrased, by 10.0% (+8 crimes). The chart shows the trend is similar to 2023, but with signifiacn inceases in July and August.



Keep Them Out!

- Remember Lock your car at all times when parking, and don't leave valuables on view
- Remember leave lights on in your property if you're going to be out after dusk; as many properties targeted appeared unoccupied
- Remember Most burglars enter a premises from the rear, and many burglaries take place during the day



- Remember Burglars hate security deadlocks on doors because they can't open them from the inside, and have to leave through a window
- Remember Double check all windows and doors are securely locked before leaving home; on winter evenings keep lights on when out
- Remember Make sure sheds and gates are locked, and outside bins are not left where burglars could use them as a stepping stone.
- Remember If your vehicle is "keyless", keep the key in a "Faraday" pouch or metal tin and keep keys AWAY from front door or kitchen window
