#### In this edition:

We send regular email details of burglaries and vehicle crimes, courtesy of Elmbridge police. We also have access to the underlying data for all neighbourhood crime, and so below is an update of *all* Neighbourhood crime types from Jan '21 to Dec '24, with a comparison between years and identifying trends.

#### Crime map review

As before, our crime data is grouped by electoral wards. (For anyone uncertain of the boundaries of the wards, there's a map at the end of this article). To provide a reasonable comparison, we have reviewed data in the new format dating back to Jan 2021 and up to the latest available data.

First, to set the scene for crime rates, let's view how Elmbridge compares with the rest of Surrey.

An analysis (above), from the national crime data for Surrey for the half year Jan-Jun 2024 reveals that, for the first time, Elmbridge (*highlighted yellow*) had the 2<sup>nd</sup> lowest overall crime rate out of the 11 boroughs in Surrey! Previously it had been 4<sup>th</sup> lowest, and the 3 boroughs with lower crime rates were more rural (Mole Valley, Surrey Heath and Waverley).

Of the 14 neighbourhood crime types, the 4 highest rates in previous years (*highlighted orange*) had been Violence & Sexual Offences, Anti-social Behaviour, Public Order, and Criminal Damage & Arson, accounting for 64% of the total crime (65% in 2023).

These are also closely related, as often what would otherwise be an ASB offence could easily become a violence offence (if the suspect pushes someone), or a public order offence (if the activities intimidate innocent bystanders), or a criminal damage offence (if the activities result in something being damaged).

Looking at these 4 crime types combined provides a much smoother crime trend. (Within Elmbridge, Violence and Sexual Offences were rarely sexual and most violent crimes were common assault.)

Next, let's compare the crime data for the 16 electoral wards within Elmbridge.

These tables use data from the Office for National Statistics. Each electoral ward is made up of a number of smaller areas containing, on average, a similar numbers of households (650), and that data is used here to provide the number of crimes per 1,000 households for a reasonable comparison. Walton Central has improved from 2023, from highest overall crime rate in Elmbridge to 3<sup>rd</sup> highest in 2024, Walton North has improved slightly from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> highest, but Walton South has worsened slightly from 6<sup>th</sup> lowest to 7<sup>th</sup>.

Looking at total crimes in 2024 we find a fairly similar breakdown of crime types across the 3 wards. The 'behavioural' crimes (referred to earlier) collectively account for about 2/3 to 3/4 of all crime, followed by other theft and vehicle crime.

Now, we can compare annual crime data for this year with last year.


The table below shows, by ward, the variation in numbers of crimes between Jan-Jun 2023 and 2024, with crime types sorted from highest to lowest (top to bottom) numbers of crimes for the Walton region as a whole.

The next column shows, for comparison, the same figures for the whole of Elmbridge. The final 2 columns show the actual number of each crime type for Walton in 2024, and the % of each compared to the total. Walton had an 8.4% decrease in overall crime in 2024 compared to Elmbridge with an 8.9% decrease.



All 3 wards have reduced overall crime numbers in 2024 compared to 2023. There have been increases in some crime types, specifically Vehicle crime in Walton North, Burglary in Walton South, and Other Theft in Walton North.

The following table gives a better picture of how the various crime types have changed between 2023 and 2024. They are shown in order of largest increase to largest decrease.




For a better idea of annual trends we need to look in comparison to previous years' crime rates. First, we see that the overall crime rate started below and has trended steadily, near or below 2023 levels.




We saw (above) that In the whole of 2023 across Elmbridge, of the 14 neighbourhood crime types, the 4 highest rates (apart from Other Theft and Vehicle Crime) were Violence and Sexual Offences, Anti-social Behaviour (ASB), Public Order, and Criminal Damage and Arson, collectively accounting for 68.0% (two thirds) of the total crime.

You see here the same trend as with total crime, suggesting that this is the main factor in that trend. All 3 Walton wards have trended in a similar fashion and all 3 have reduced their totals compared with 2023; Walton Central -8%, Walton North -1% and Walton South -8%.




The crimes that most impact residents are Vehicle Crime and Burglary, accounting for 26.1% and 6.0% respectively of the total crime for the year. Vehicle crime decreased across Elmbridge (-26.7%), and Walton also decreased (-32.3%).

Walton Central has been trending the same as in 2023 but lower (-54%); Walton North has trended the same (-28%) although Walton South peaked above 2023 levels in Mar-Apr and Oct-Dec iin March and April, but only by +4 crimes (+8%).




. Burglary has decreased by 25 (-28%) compared to 2023, but we are talking relatively small numbers, accounting for only 3.3% of total crime. Walton Central has -15, Walton Nprth has -25 whilst Walton South has +15 (the latter down to two peaks in February and October).



The remaining 8 crime types, across Walton as a whole, account for the remaining 22% of all crime this year. Of those only 3 show any increase over 2023; Other Theft (+11) Theft from the Person (+1) and Robbery (+3),



### **Keep Them Out!**

- Remember Lock your car at all times when parking, and don't leave valuables on view
- Remember leave lights on in your property if you're going to be out after dusk; as many properties targeted appeared unoccupied
- Remember Most burglars enter a premises from the rear, and many burglaries take place during the day



- Remember Burglars hate security deadlocks on doors because they can't open them from the inside, and have to leave through a window
- Remember Double check all windows and doors are securely locked before leaving home; on winter evenings keep lights on when out
- Remember Make sure sheds and gates are locked, and outside bins are not left where burglars could use them as a stepping stone.
- Remember If your vehicle is "keyless", keep the key in a "Faraday" pouch or metal tin and keep keys AWAY from front door or kitchen window
